The American Diabetes Association® (ADA) has proudly established the "Andrew P. Goldberg Early Career Award" in recognition of Dr. Goldberg's exceptional contributions to the field of aging research and diabetes and his lifelong devotion to mentoring.



DR. GOLDBERG'S LEGACY

Throughout his career, Dr. Goldberg's research was focused on the role of lifestyle, physical activity, and obesity on the metabolic precursors for type 2 diabetes and its complications, including cardiovascular disease in older adults. He led seminal studies of the effects of weight loss and exercise on metabolism in older men and women and was continuously supported by the NIH to perform this research throughout his career. He was a dedicated mentor who was passionate about supporting the growth and development of young clinical researchers in the field.

The "Andrew P. Goldberg Early Career Award" will be presented annually to an ADA Scholar who is an early career professional with a similar focus.

This award is intended to serve as a meaningful tribute to Dr. Goldberg and as means of sustaining his legacy by supporting the growth and learning of others pursuing a career in clinical and/or translational research.

The ADA Scholars Program:

The ADA Scholars program is a career development program for early-career professionals who treat and/or research diabetes and its complications.
